








cultivating the ability to learn 6 years in 3 stages

Contrary to the Kanto area where Elementary school children spend their afternoons and weekends in cram schools, Fukushima Seikei's students usually have had a free and relaxed childhood. Still, however, having spent six years at Seikei they reach astonishing academic levels. Our curriculum takes their physical, mental and social growth into account and supplies them with the right basics, attitude, motivation, knowledge and finally know-how to master all challenges.

Guided Reading
For the first two years our students spend the first 30 minutes each morning reading, choosing from 100 books covering the fields of Biography, Natural Science, Social Studies, Humanities and Further reading.
